The Kentucky State Board accepts either undergraduate or graduate hours for credit toward certification. The Union College Chemical Dependency Counselor satisfies the 270-contact hour requirement, including the 6-hour ethics training requirement. Completion of the Chemical Dependency Counselor Certificate does not guarantee certification by the Kentucky Board, but provides the requisite academic background to sit for the CADC examination. It is the student's responsibility to check reciprocal agreements among different states.

Kentucky State Board Certification Requirements

The applicant must be at least 18 years of age, and must be able to document the following:

- Baccalaureate or master's degree
- Board approved experience working with alcohol or drug dependent persons (300 hours of which have been under the direct supervision of a certified alcohol and drug counselor who has at least 2 years of post-certification experience)
 - * 6000 hours at the Baccalaureate level
 - * 2000 hours at the master's level
- 270 Classroom hours of board approved curriculum (satisfied by Union College 21 credit hour program)
- Six hours of ethics training and two hours of training in the transmission, control, treatment, and prevention of HIV (satisfied by the Ethics course offered as part of the Union College 12 credit hour program).
- Passing score on written exam approved by the International Certification Reciprocity Consortium on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse
- Signed agreement to abide by standards of practice and code of ethics
