Admission to the major is a competitive process in December of sophomore year. Guidelines follow:

- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 (will likely require higher GPA to be competitive)
- Completion of at least 45 credit hours prior to application
- Completion of all nursing pre-requisite classes and Liberal Education Core requirements
- Minimum ACT score of 18
- Completion of the Kaplan Admissions Exam prior to application
- Admission score based on GPA (25%), ACT (25%), Admission Exam (50%)

• Students with top 36 scores will be admitted; approximately 5 additional students will be placed on waiting list until the classes start in the fall
